Writing with Clarity: Five Tips

- 1. Be concise: eliminate words that perform no rhetorical function.
- 2. Do not be repetitive.
- 3. Eliminate overuse of the verb "to be." (You may use it once every 10 sentences.)
- 4. Use active verbs, not passive ones. Use a passive construction only when one wants to emphasize the object of a sentence rather than the subject.
- 5. Eliminate sentences beginning with "there" or "it"; for example, "there is," "it was," "there were," etc.
